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Board of Directors Regular Meeting

Tuesday, April 13, 2021 at 2:00 pm Old TMC Building – DPW Compound Meeting Minutes

I. Call to order:

Chairman Alejo Sablan called the meeting to order at 2:06 pm.

II. Roll Call and Opening Remarks:

GRTA Board Members present: Chairman Alejo Sablan, Vice-Chairman David Arentz, Director Bernadette Wiemann and Director Anthony Chargualaf. A quorum was established. Director Kevin Susuico later joined at 2:16pm.

III. Review of Minutes:

Board Members reviewed the March 9, 2021 meeting minutes. Director Anthony Chargualaf motioned to approve the minutes and Director Bernadette Wiemann seconded it. Meeting minutes was approved with 4 yeas and 0 nays.

IV. Public Participation - 3 minutes per individual:

Mr. Thomas Higa asked if GRTA is doing a Shuttle Service with Plumeria Bingo. He saw in the paper Plumeria Bingo had a flyer with the GRTA logo that says Shuttle Service available.

Staff Member Richard Ybanez stated GRTA is not operating a Shuttle Service for Plumeria Bingo and that people may call our office to get more information to apply for our fixed route or paratransit services.

V. Management Reports:

A. Transit Management System: Chairman Alejo Sablan asked Staff Member Marlon Molinos on the status of Amble since he is the Point of Contact. Staff Member Molinos stated it is going really well, there were some issues, but we were able to get them fixed. Due to the pandemic not a lot of the riders are going out, but there still was an increase of Amble users from last month. Executive Manager Celestin Babauta explained to the Board the big advantage of the Amble app is it allows our paratransit riders another option to schedule their rides. Instead of calling in they can download the app and schedule their rides which reduces the volume of phone calls that are called into the Transit Management Center. Chairman Sablan asked Staff Member Molinos if the app has been receiving positive feedback. Staff Member Molinos stated it has been receiving positive feedback. Executive Manager Babauta added there's an integration on the TMS with Fixed Route. Our Fixed Route utilizes the tablets which enables our Transit Management Center dispatchers to effectively monitor the location of the buses and they will be able to have real life information in terms of how many riders on the bus and if they are on time or delayed somewhere. Director Bernadette Wiemann

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inquired about how the Routematch pay is going. Executive Manager Babauta explained we had a Zoom meeting with Routematch and they are still doing some research to determine the best approach regarding the payment system. Since technology is constantly changing, we are thinking of ways to pay directly from a smartphone instead of using a smart card. Mr. Babauta informed the Board by the next meeting we should have more concrete update on the payment system. Chairman Sablan believes the reason for the high on-time performance rate is because of the tablets. Executive Manager Babauta stated GRTA is averaging about 95% on-time arrivals and departures and we continue to monitor that percentage very closely. - B. Accelerating Innovative Mobility Grant: Executive Manager Babauta explained the AIM grant is a grant that GRTA competed with hundreds of transit agencies throughout the United States and because of our application we were awarded \$1.9 million dollars with matching local funding of \$446,480. Mr. Babauta stated it's a bit frustrating with the Local Government because they cut our budget and now, we are struggling to find the funds for the matching for this grant. We have been in communication with UOG and Routematch in moving this grant forward. Mr. Babauta mentioned one thing neat about this grant is that GRTA will be engaging with University of Guam and Uber Routematch to do a feasibility study on the Mobility on Demand, it's an Uber type transit system. If that type of transit system is viable on Guam and the leaders decide to pursue it, then it's an opportunity for our people to schedule their rides on the mobile app and a vehicle will pick them up. - C. Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Grants: Executive Manager Babauta explained to the Board. GRTA has several grants, thanks to the Federal Transit Administration because without them we will be in a very challenging position. For the FY2021 Grant, GRTA was awarded \$1.9 million dollars, FY2020 we were also awarded \$1.9 million dollars. We budgeted to procure more buses and maintenance. Mr. Babauta further explained regarding the Bus and Bus Facilities this was another competitive grant that GRTA competed with over 150 transit agencies throughout the United States and we were awarded \$9.5 million dollars. Executive Manager Babauta mentioned the Government of Guam has never won a competitive grant with this magnitude, thanks to Staff Member Virgil Penafiel and other staff members who helped in this regard. This grant will fund our Park and Ride Facility that will be built in Dededo. We are working with Senator Pedo Terlaje and Senator Mary Torres and they will be assigning a Legislation Bill Number to have the property transferred over to GRTA. Executive Manager Babauta stated we have budgeted over \$6 million dollars to purchase 8 (eight) 38-passenger electric buses and 8 (eight) electric cars. This allows riders from Dededo, Yigo, Andersen Air Force Base and Marine Corps Base Camp Blaz areas who are in need of transportation to the Park and Ride Facility. They can download the app, schedule their ride and an electric car will pick them up. They will be dropped off at the Park and Ride Facility and then get transported to wherever they need to go. He mentioned without these Federal funds, GRTA will not be able to purchase all these buses. Director Bernadette Wiemann inquired if the \$25,000 was for the bus shelter construction in Inalahan. Mr. Babauta stated the bus shelter for Inalahan is from a FEMA grant with a matching from the Local Government. He further states the



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\$25,000 to construct the bus shelter was budgeted from the FY20 Grant and will be working on the design and location of where the shelter will be situated. Please see attached report from Staff Member Shaianna Palacios.

- D. <u>Paratransit</u>: As of April 6, 2021, GRTA has a total of 647 paratransit riders, 10 renewals, 7 new applicants and 3 deceased which were removed from the total number of paratransit riders. Please see attached report from Staff Member Jackie Taitano.
- E. Complaints: As of April 6, 2021, GRTA received 2 complaints for Fixed Route and 7 complaints for Paratransit, one complaint is pending and 8 have been closed. Director Wiemann asked what was the one pending complaint. Staff Member Marlon Molinos stated as of April 13, 2021 that complaint has been closed and is currently working on 5 new complaints. Director Wiemann mentioned she has been a paratransit and fixed route rider going on 6 years and her observation in the past years had a lot of discrepancies, from the old buses and the old administration to the administration now. She would like to commend all the staff at GRTA and our Executive Manager for doing a great job. Director Wiemann shared her experience when she rode Greyline the Friday prior to the Board Meeting. She mentioned she was very pleased on how her bus trip went. Vice-Chairman David Arentz agreed with Director Wiemann on the great improvements GRTA has shown from the previous years. Please see attached report from Staff Member Marlon Molinos.
- F. Maintenance/Vehicle Fleet: As of April 12, 2021, GRTA currently has 17 out of 23 operational ADA compliant vehicles, 9 MV1's and 8 Arbocs. Executive Manager Babauta informed the Board Staff Member Rolando Dydasco has been out on medical leave and since then Staff Member Mark Crisostomo has taken over. The maintenance team have been working hard to upkeep our vehicles. Please see attached report from Staff Member Mark Crisostomo.
- G. Ridership Data Paratransit: The total scheduled paratransit ridership for the month of March is 6,928. Chairman Sablan was pleased to see the daily on-time performance percentage, some as high as 98%. Director Wiemann commends how operations is now compared to the previous years, buses are either on-time or early. She mentioned the dispatchers and schedulers are all doing a great job as well. Please see attached report from Staff Member Margaret Nauta.
- H. Ridership Data Fixed Route: The total Fixed Route ridership for the month of March is 6,290. Chairman Sablan stated in the last Board Meeting he brought up his concerns with the Southern Shuttle because low amount of ridership, since then it's picking up. He encourages people to ride our Southern Shuttle to visit the beautiful southern parts of the island. Please see attached report from Staff Member Margaret Nauta.
- I. <u>Budget:</u> Executive Manager Babauta explained to the Board looking at the local budget, from now until the end of this Fiscal Year in September we still have about \$526,000 balance that has already been released to us and \$512,801 in reserves. We are constantly looking at our budget to ensure we remain in the blue rather than in the red. He further explained we are able to sustain with what we have now with of course help from the Federal Government. Please see attached reports from Staff Member Jennifer Cruz.
- J. <u>Procurement:</u> Executive Manager Babauta mentioned the highlight of the procurement are the buses. We have spent \$1.6 million dollars for 10 (ten) 14-passenger buses with lifts, these are the



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buses we ordered as of the result of the protest. He stated during a telephone conference with himself, Rally, Autospot and Soderholm, they are working hard to have those buses delivered to us by June/July timeframe. Rally and John are working on another procurement package for 6 buses at \$1.1 million dollars, all federal funds. Chairman Sablan inquired about the grant match of \$446,480 that was returned by GSA. Executive Manager Babauta stated we are currently working on that issue, that is part of the AIM Grant. He will be working with Staff Members Jennifer Cruz, Shaianna Palacios and Rally Pilipina to balance out our federal and local funds. Please see attached report from Staff Member Jennifer Cruz.

- K. Projects: Chairman Sablan asked Staff Member John Dizon what is the latest on the Drug and Alcohol Program. Staff Member John Dizon explained to the Board he is working with our Chief Planner to procure for the Drug and Alcohol Testing Services. He further explained we used stateside specifications and are currently conducting the local market research to see any existing vendors on Guam who can provide DOT complied Drug and Alcohol Testing Services and to see a price quote from each vendor. Staff Member Rally Pilipina mentioned we are done with the final review of the specs; we are now working on the marketing research. Staff Member John Dizon and his alternate Drug and Alcohol Program Manager had registered to attend the 15th Annual FTA Drug and Alcohol Program National Conference that will be held from May 12th through the 15th. Please see attached report from Staff Member John Dizon.
- L. GRTA Facility: Executive Manager Babauta informed the Board he communicated with Mr. Belanger and provided the documents he needed to work with Geotechnical Engineer to begin the soil sampling and drilling. This will determine if the soil is adequate to build a structure for GRTA. Upon completion of this, hopefully everything goes well we can proceed to the 60 percent design. Executive Manager Babauta mentioned he communicated with the Governor's Chief of Staff that we have to complete the design by July 3, 2021. DPW and GSA will have to work together to clear the property. Mr. Babauta stated if we complete the 60 percent design by July, we can perhaps have groundbreaking in September/October of this year. He added the Chief of Staff directed him to ensure DPW and GSA work on clearing the property. The first Invitation for Bid (IFB) didn't attract any bidders so we would need to resubmit. If there are no bidders on the second IFB they would have to look into relocating the items to another area. Please see attached report from Executive Manager Celestin Babauta.
- M. Advertisement: Staff Member Richard Ybanez stated IT&E and GTA are the new customers that signed the 1-year contract with GRTA. He further stated GTA will be advertising on 4 buses, 2 for Paratransit and 2 for Fixed Route. Docomo and IP&E/Shell are supposed to be turning in their signed contracts soon. Staff Member Ybanez informed the Board, along with the advertisings on the outside of the buses he is looking at interior advertising as well. He will be working with Executive Manager Babauta on a policy for the interior advertising in our vehicles. Director Wiemann asked how we are getting the word out to the public. Staff Member Ybanez stated before he would make phone calls to potential customers, but now that the advertisements are up on our buses, he's the one receiving the phone calls. Please see attached report from Staff Member Richard Ybanez.



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- N. Guam Homeless Coalition & Veterans: Chairman Sablan mentioned based on the reports the Veterans have been getting a lot of help and it's increasing from the beginning of the month. Staff Member Mark Crisostomo explained as of April 13, 2021 the Guam Homeless Coalition did a mass COVID-19 vaccination in Hagatna, about 75 homeless unsheltered people were transported there to get vaccinated. GRTA has a total of 21 active clients for the Guam Homeless Coalition and we are anticipating more. The Coalition will make contact with the individuals and if they are willing to be a part of the program they will then get registered with the Coalition and have access to GRTA's services. Staff Member Mark Crisostomo stated the Homeless Coalition has two goals, to get a roof over their head and employment. He added we have one homeless client that got a job and we take him to and from work. Staff Member Jackie Taitano asked when does the service stop when one finds a job and a place to stay. Staff Member Crisostomo stated the Guam Homeless Coalition will determine that not GRTA. Executive Manager Babauta noted this program is funded by the CARES Act. Staff Member Taitano wanted to ensure all the data is being collected for FTA purposes. According to Staff Member Crisostomo they are collecting all the data. Please see attached reports from Staff Member Mark Crisostomo.
- O. <u>Park and Ride</u>: Executive Manager Babauta informed the Board the latest information he has is that Legislation has been introduced, a Bill number will be assigned to transfer the property over to GRTA. The application on TRAMs has been submitted and once FTA reviews the application and concurs with it, we will be requested to accept the grant and be able to utilize the \$9.5 million dollars. Please see attached report from Executive Manager Celestin Babauta.

VI. Old Business:

A. <u>GRTA Goals 2021</u>: Executive Manager Babauta informed the Board we are stilling working on the goals that was passed out during our last Board Meeting. We are currently working on the A & E design, procuring more buses and the Request for Proposal (RFP) for the 5-year master plan.

VII. New Business:

A. Working with Parks and Recreation — Bathroom facilities: Executive Manager explained to the Board he received advice from Legal Counsel about the porta-potty we have at the Hagatna Pool bus shelter. The Legal Counsel stated it was fine, but if we want to keep the porta-potty we would have to address the needs for people with disabilities. Department of Parks and Recreation Director Roke Alcantara informed Mr. Babauta, the Hagatna Pool bathrooms were vandalized. Mr. Babauta asked if we can get an assessment to see how much it will cost to fix it. Director Kevin Susuico stated that he brought up this concern at a previous Board Meeting, we do one for one we will eventually have to do one for all with regards to placing porta-potties at all bus shelters. Director Susuico understands providing service to our riders, but at the same time we are opening up doors to different regulations that we will have to be following. Director Susuico also mentioned if we decide to get an ADA compliant portapotty we will eventually have to get a hand washing station and there will be a lot more fees that will be attached to the overall cost. Director Wiemann mentioned looking into utilizing the Hagatna Pool restrooms because ultimately, it's the people of Guam that we are providing service to. Director



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Susuico reiterated his concerns about providing only one porta-potty, we will eventually have to provide for all the bus shelters. He mentioned looking into another grant to help with the cost if we want to provide more porta-potties because of how costly it is. Director Susuico added if someone were to slip and fall in the porta-potty and blames GRTA, then we would be looking at legal issues. Director Wiemann expressed that what she is trying to do is to provide better services for the people of Guam. Director Susuico explained it's not that we don't want to provide services to the people of Guam, we just have to provide it the right way. He said there is no consistency if we only have one porta-potty at one bus shelter and not the others. We need to provide services to all the people and accommodate their needs. Vice-Chairman David Arentz stated all of this will pretty much be dictated by funding. Director Wiemann stated she made a mistake by not providing an ADA compliant portapotty at the Hagatna Pool bus shelter and we should put one in immediately. Staff Member Jackie Taitano mentioned there is no Federal Regulation that states as a Transportation Agency with the services we provide that we need to provide restrooms at the bus shelters, it is not a requirement. She further stated, like what Director Susuico mentioned, we do one for one we will have to do one for all. We have received complaints as to why only Hagatna Pool bus shelter has a porta-potty and not Harmon Drugs or the Barrigada bus stops. Staff Member Jackie Taitano explained to the Board when we talk about ADA we really have to think about the accessibility, we have to think of the big picture and then of course funding is always the big issue. Executive Manager Babauta mentioned to the Board he will do further research on the cost of an ADA compliant porta-potty and report back to them. Chairman Sablan is hoping Director Alcantara will agree for us to renovate the restrooms at the Hagatna Pool.

B. Discussions with Congressman Mike San Nicolas: Executive Manager Babauta informed the Board he communicated with Congressman Mike San Nicolas about a month ago and had a Zoom meeting last Saturday. The Congressman is really working hard to provide GRTA will funding to transform our transit system in Guam. He asked Mr. Babauta to put together a proposal. Mr. Babauta asked to budget about \$15 million dollars to build a transfer station in Hagatna. Mr. Babauta explained to the Board we need to ensure the transfer station is ADA compliant, a LEED certified facility that is sustainable and addresses climate change, has charging stations, an area for vendors to sale food items and of course a transfer facility that will accommodate all the buses that will be coming in from the different routes. The \$15 million dollars will also cover Project Management, Technical Assistance, Infrastructure, Architectural & Engineering, Site Preparation, Charging Stations, LEED Platinum Certified Facility and of course the construction of the facility. Another item listed is to purchase electric buses. The Congressman wanted us to request for enough buses that will increase the interval of those buses going out to the various bus stops. Mr. Babauta budgeted for 42 buses, but the Congressman wanted to increase it, so we are looking at requesting for about 150 buses. The 150 buses will allow GRTA to have 30-minute intervals so riders won't have to wait long and we will have back up vehicles to perform preventive maintenance and to assist in the event a bus breaks down. Director Susuico is appreciative the Congressman is trying to help purchase more buses, but he wanted to know where will the money for the staff come from. Director Susuico asked would it be possible if the Federal Government pay for more bus drivers. Executive Manager Babauta stated he will



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communicate with Congressman San Nicolas and resubmit GRTA's request. Mr. Babauta mentioned the Congressman would also like to put up bus shelters throughout the villages. GRTA will need to communicate with Director Angel Sablan to see how many shelters are needed and to draft up a Resolution to support the need for more bus shelters. This is all part of the \$2.3 trillion dollar Infrastructure Legislation Proposal that the President is submitting to Congress. Director Susuico suggested we submit the request to Director Sablan now or he can introduce that the Congressman is requesting for support in a Resolution. Please see attached letter to Congressman Mike San Nicolas.

- VIII. Executive Session: Chairman Alejo Sablan called a recess at 3:43pm.
 - IX. <u>Adjournment:</u> The GRTA Board meeting reconvened at 4:14pm. Chairman Sablan adjourned the meeting at 4:15pm.

Good Afternoon Board of Directors:

Grants for Buses and Bus Facilities FY2020. Reference: Opp id: FTA-2020-006-BUS GRTA funding of \$9,558,120

- Funding is forthcoming after the administrative entry process TBA.
- Once the budget entry process is complete, we'll implement the Project Management Task and Milestones fully.
 - I hope to have two project assistants to support my role as project manager, as I stipulated in the grant application.
- RFQ preparation for writing the electrification will begin this month. These include identifying our specific needs, outcome, and research studies as part of the process necessary to ascertain optimum efficiency of integrating and building our electrification transit system infrastructure.
- Research into electric vehicles will continue from the grant application's initial research presentation. Each year
 brings innovations and better performance. In preparation and if possible, we want to ensure that we identify
 these innovations and determine if applicable to include them in our future RFQ. These studies will consist of
 Electric Vehicles such as Sedans, Vans, Shuttles, Buses and supporting infrastructure such as charging systems.
 This research is in preparation for the RFQ write-up.
- Preliminary Discussions have been made with Routemath by Uber in anticipation of add ons for both Mobility on Demand (Uber Share Ride) and Fixed Route Intelligent Technology Systems. They are prepared and ready to support us when we begin this phase.
- As the allocation of Land for GRTA Park and Ride is in a new location. A revision for the routes allocation shown on our grant will also be adjusted to reflect the new sites for the GRTA Road to Education Commuting Route.
 Status on Land and Park and Ride, I will refer to Mr. Babauta.
- As part of the Bus and Bus Facilities funding is the technical expertise and consultation for our transit system's

Accelerating Innovative Mobility (AIM) Challenge Grant. Opp Id: FTA-2020-012-TRI-AIM: \$1,950,106 with matching local funding of \$446,480 local match. Total Project \$2,396,586.

 As of 3/3/21: U.S. Department of Transportation Federal Transit Administration Application GU-2021-001-00 has been awarded.

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- We have completed the administrative activity on TrAMS for budget allocation entry. Budget allocations
 with BBMR have also been prepared and submitted. Thanks to Shai for the TrAMS and to Jennifer for
 processing with BBMR.
- 3/24/21 As part of our AIM Project preparation, I invited our Key Partners and Colleagues from the
 University of Guam, Dr. Rachel Leon Guerrero, Professor John Rivera, and Mr. Forrest Chargualaf to our
 GRTA Office and met our Team. It allows our Research Partner a better understanding of GRTA operations
 and administration. Before our meet and greet, we met with our Director to provide his vision. To
 conclude their visit, we began preliminary discussions about AIM and the Routematch by Uber Share Ride
 Innovative Technology System, Our Technology Partner.
- A memorandum of understanding between GRTA and the University is in preparation.
- Our next activity is now confirmed for May 11, 2021 at 1 pm. We have invited Routematch by Uber to
 present the technology platform overview for our University of Guam Research Team,GRTA Team and our
 Board

 introduction is now complete, and educating our paratransit riders will continue through our website and by
 engaging our riders to try Amble, it's free, and the benefits it offers.
 - As of 3/5/21, Mr. Marlon Molinos is our Point of Contact on promoting Amble. He will be spearheading within our Paratransit Riders Listing potential users to provide a courtesy call to raise our users and deploy a regular zoom/google meet forum on Amble.
 - o 4/9/21, Mr. Molinos is providing a report on the Amble and has my full concurrence. We genuinely appreciate Marlon's hard work and dedication.
 - o I ask the TMC Team's support to assist Marlon in the registration efforts for getting the word out, registering, and coordinating with Marlon.
 - 5/6/21, See Marlons BOD report for update.
- **CUSTOMER CARE TRANSITION as of 5/06/21** (Australian Care Support Team). If we have any issues with troubleshooting our TMS System, we are now with our Routematch Australian Support Team.
- Routematch Pay Currently, Tom Coogan is working diligently on the development of our payment system.
 Payment system discussions and timeline schedule for completion will be adjusted as needed. As per the update from Tom, due to unforeseeable circumstances and ProPay no longer an eligible provider for PSP services, we will be working with World Pay and expect completion of the integration by the end of 2021 with a planned implementation on Q1 / Q2 timeframe in 2022.



GRTA PROJECTS

Drug and Alcohol Program:

The purpose of the Drug and Alcohol Program is to help prevent accidents, injuries, and fatalities resulting from the misuse of alcohol and use of prohibited drugs by employees who perform safety-sensitive functions. Covered employees that perform safety-sensitive functions include the bus drivers, dispatchers and schedulers, and mechanics. The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) requires that all recipients of FTA funds and their contractors to implement this program, as specified in 49 CFR Part 655. After board resolution of the Drug and Alcohol policy, the agency is working on procuring the Drug and Alcohol Testing Services.

- The Program Coordinator I and his Alternate Drug and Alcohol Program Manager will be attending the 15th Annual FTA Drug and Alcohol Program National Conference this week. The following list are times in which the virtual sessions will be held when converted from Eastern Daylight Time to local time.
 - Wednesday, May 12, 2021: 12:00 AM to 5:00 AM
 - Thursday, May 13, 2021: 1:00 AM to 6:15 AM
 - o Friday, May 14, 2021: 1:00 AM to 6:15 AM
 - o Saturday, May 15, 2021: 1:00 AM to 4:25 AM
- The Program Coordinator I had received the results of the market research and completed the supporting documents for the Invitation for Bid (IFB). The IFB packet is currently forwarded to the Chief Planner for his review of the bid specifications and supporting documents.
- Once more federal funds become available, a requisition will be requested from the Administration and Finance section for the procurement of the Drug and Alcohol Testing Services. The amount of funds needed will be based on the results of the market research.


State Management Review:

The purpose of the State Management Review (SMR) is to provide a comprehensive oversight review of the agency's current management practices and program implementation. This triennial review is conducted every three years, which involves a reviewer scrutinizing documents and records to determine if the agency is in adherence to the Federal Transit Administration's regulations. The agency is currently collecting the required documents, records, and data for the reviewer to make the determination of our compliance. Any deficiencies during the review will be reported to the agency and corrective actions will be implemented to resolve them.

- The reviewers from RLS Associates are currently providing technical assistance for the State
 Management Review every Wednesdays from 9:00 AM to 10:00 AM. The purpose of the technical assistance is to provide guidance and feedback of the submitted documents before the actual review.
- The technical assistance for the State Management Review is provided to the agency for eight weeks
 up until July. The meetings are conducted virtually through the Google Meet application and consists
 of the RLS Associates staff, Executive Manager, and the GRTA staff.

The list of corrections that need to be made for each submitted documents will be sent by RLS
 Associates staff through e-mail, so that the GRTA staff may begin to address any compliance issues
 prior to the actual review. As a result, there would be minimal issues identified during the review.

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise:

The purpose of the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) is to ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of FTA-assisted contracts. The program helps to create a level playing field in which DBEs can compete fairly for FTA-assisted contracts. DBEs are for-profit small business concerns where socially and economically disadvantaged individuals own at least 51% interest and also control management and daily business operations. The agency is working to finalize the DBE policy, shortfall analysis, training opportunities, and outreach events to educate DBEs and small businesses of our procurement projects for FYs 2021 to 2023.

- A Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Policy for Fiscal Years 2021 to 2023 has been finalized, which describes the regulations and procedures to implement this program. The policy would undergo board approval prior to submission on the Transit Award Management System.
- The DBE policy's overall goal is 11.5% (\$546,342), which sets a percentage of federal-aid funds to be expended based on the anticipated participation of DBEs. The agency will maintain good faith efforts to meet the goal by ensuring outreach efforts are made with DBEs and small businesses.
- The DBE shortfall percentage is 1.62%, which meant that none of the procurement projects from Fiscal Year 2018 to 2020 were awarded to DBEs. The reasons for the shortfall include the lack of a Unified Certification Program (UCP) and lack of staff who were trained to certify DBEs.
- As part of the corrective actions, outreach efforts will be made to DBEs and small businesses on a
 weekly basis of every month. DBEs and small businesses will be educated of the procurement projects
 and resources they can avail to in order to address issues on finance, bonding, and insurance.

ADOPTION OF DISADVANTAGE BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (DBE) PROGRAM POLICY STATEMENT

WHEREAS, the Guam Regional Transit Authority (GRTA) is duly established under 12 GCA Chapter 6 and is thereby empowered to apply for and receive Department of Transportation (DOT) financial assistance; and

WHEREAS, Federal Regulation 19 CFR Part 26, as amended, requires grant recipients to prepare and establish Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Programs, subject to DOT approval; and

WHEREAS, except to the extent the Secretary of Transportation determines otherwise, section 106(c) of the Surface Transportation and Uniform Relocation Assistance Act of 1987 requires that a goal be set not less than 10 percent of the funds authorized to be appropriated by the Act be expended with small business concerns owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals, as defined by section 3 and 8(d) of the Small Business Act and relevant subcontracting regulations promulgated pursuant thereto. Nevertheless, this 10 percent goal is an aspiration goal at the national level, which the Department of Transportation uses as a tool in evaluating and monitoring DBE's opportunities to participate in DOT-assisted contracts. The national 10 percent goal does not authorize or require GRTA to set overall or contract goals at the 10 percent level, or any particular level, or to take any special administrative steps, if GRTA's goals are above or below 10 percent; and

WHEREAS, it is the policy and intent of the Guam Regional Transit Authority to comply with applicable federal and state laws to ensure that DBEs have an equal opportunity to receive and participate in DOT-assisted contracts. It is also GRTA policy: to ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of DOT-assisted contracts in DOT's transit assistance programs, to create a level playing field on which DBEs can compete fairly for DOT-assisted contracts, to ensure that GRTA's DBE program is narrowly tailored in accordance with the applicable laws, to ensure that only firms that fully meet 49 CFR Part 26 eligibility standards are permitted to participate as DBEs, to help remove barriers to the participation of DBEs in DOT-assisted contracts and to assist the development of firms that can compete successfully in the marketplace outside the DBE program.

The national 10 percent goal does not authorize or require GRTA to set overall or contract goals at the 10 percent level, or any particular level, or to take any special administrative steps, if GRTA's goals are above or below 10 percent; and

WHEREAS, GRTA has adopted a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program Policy statement in accordance with applicable federal regulations; and

WHEREAS, GRTA triennially adopts DBE overall goal in accordance with applicable federal regulations; and

WHEREAS, it is the policy and intent of the Guam Regional Transit Authority to comply with applicable federal and state laws to ensure that DBEs have an equal opportunity to receive and participate in DOT-assisted contracts. It is also our policy: to ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of DOT-assisted contracts in DOT's transit assistance programs, to create a level playing field on which DBEs can compete fairly for DOT-assisted contracts, to ensure that GRTA's DBE program is narrowly tailored in accordance with the applicable laws, to ensure that only firms that fully meet 49 CFR Part 26 eligibility standards are permitted to participate as DBEs, to help remove barriers to the participation of DBEs in DOT-assisted contracts and to assist the development of firms that can compete successfully in the marketplace outside the DBE program.

DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (DBE) PROGRAM POLICY STATEMENT

The Guam Regional Transit Authority (GRTA) has established a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program in accordance with regulations of the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), 49 CFR Part 26, GRTA will receive federal financial assistance from the Department of Transportation, and as a condition of receiving this assistance, GRTA will sign an assurance that it will comply with 49 CFR Part 26.
